S.A. ZIONIST ADVISORY COUNCIL

To Meet in Johannesburg During Week-End

IT was resolved at the South African Zionist Conference held in Kimberley three months ago that there should be created a South African Zionist Advisory Council of some 25 memrepresentative of the Zionists of the various parts of South Africa, which should meet the Federation's Executive at least once between the successive biennial Conferences and act in an advisory and consultative capacity to the Executive.

Whilst this Council will be normally elected at each successive South African Zionist Conference, it was decided to give the present Executive power meanwhile to establish a Council shortly after the Conference. Furthermore the Executive was given power to convene the Council as and when it considered advisable.

Accordingly the Federation's Executive has called the Council into being by apointing leading representatives of the various provinces and areas, and has decided to convene a meeting of the Council in Johannesburg this week-end.

It will be held in the Zionist Hall (Coronation Hall) commencing to-morrow evening, November 6, and continuing in the morning and afternoon of Sunday. Representatives are coming from Capetown, Western Province, Border and Griqualand West, Free State, Natal, Rhodesia and Transvaal. There will also be present all those members of the South African delegation to the recent Zionist Congress in Zurich who are back in the country and available.

The meeting will concern itself with all matters affecting the Zionist situation in general and the position and furtherance of Zionist work in South Africa in particular.

Rabbi I. S. Graubart, of Brooklyn, U.S.A., has arrived in Johannesburg. He recently took a trip to Central Europe and made a close study of the conditions in which the Jewish people live in these countries. Rabbi Graubart has come to South Africa in order to interest his brethren in the urgent needs of the Jewish population of Poland.
