Other Centres.

OTHER dates for campaign meetings on the Reef so far arranged, are Nigel on Sunday, July 10, and Randfontein, on Monday, July 11.

Engagements which have been tentatively fixed are Roodepoort on Tuesday, July 5, and Krugersdorp, on Thursday, July 7, and a Keren Hayesod rally in Brakpan of the youth of East Rand on Wednesday, July 13.

Outside the Transvaal.

THE movements of members of the delegation outside of the Transvaal are not yet known with certainty. One of the difficulties that arises in this connection is the fact that both Rev. Perlzweig and Mrs. Ginzberg can only make a very limited stay in South Africa, with the result that the number of places they can visit is unfortunately likely to be very restricted. Meantime, provisional dates have been arranged for a flying visit by Mr. Perlzweig, after leaving Johannesburg, to Rhodesia, also probably taking in Port Elizabeth and East London, Capetown and Durban.

RABBI GOLD TALKS TO YOUNG MIZRACHI

THE aims and ideals of the Hapoel Hamizrachi were outlined by Rabbi Wolf Gold, in the course of a stirring address delivered by him at a reception given in his honour on Saturday night at the Carlton Hotel by the Young Mizrachi Organisation.

Torah and labour, said Rabbi Gold, constituted the basis of the ideology of the Hapoel Hamizrachi. The two, the spirit and the body as it were, were inseparable entities, and it was impossible for the one to exist without the other.

The Torah held that work was not merely a duty but also a privilege. Everybody had to make his contribution to the world or become a parasite. It was in the recognition of this principle that the Hapoel Hamizrachi carried out their courageous pioneering tasks in Palestine.

The Hapoel Hamizrachi also performed their work in the belief that Jewish life in Palestine had to be different from Jewish life anywhere else in the world, that it had to be based on the principles of Judaism, the Torah and of the prophets. They lived a "spiritual" life in the real sense of the term.

Referring to the Communist and Fascist movements, Rabbi Gold said that neither of these could ever solve the problem of humanity, because both relied for their success on physical force. The Communists believed that they had discovered a new solution to the problems of the world, but long before the rise of Marxism the Torah had delved into these problems and laid down principles for the well-being and content of all, for the elimination of class differences and of oppression of the poor. The Torah held that every human being was entitled to a place in the world, that everyone had to make his contribution to the common weal.

The world had to revive its faith in its responsibility to a Supreme Intelligence. People would have to realise that they could not exist without God.

Rabbi Gold appealed to his young listeners to think deeply about the problems that faced them and not to be afraid of acting in accordance with their convictions.

Mr. J. Green presided and speeches were delivered by Rabbi I. Kossowsky, who stressed the fact that the youth were the bearers of the Jewish religion and traditions, by Mr. S. Levin on behalf of the S.A. Zionist Youth Council, and Mr. Goldberg on behalf of the Transvaal Zionist Youth Council. A letter conveying his apologies for non-attendance, owing to ill-health, was read from Dr. J. L. Landau.

A vote of thanks to Rabbi Gold was proposed by Mr. Kaplan.



Senator Copeland Pass

The death occurred in New York on Saturday of Senator Copeland, a well-known ability and leader. He was born in the United States in 1868 and took a post-graduate course in law in various countries in Europe. For a number of years he served as commissioner for health for the City of New York.

In 1920 he was elected Senator and took a prominent part in the life, using his powerful influence in favour of democratic ideals. Senator Copeland had a number of relatives in South Africa.

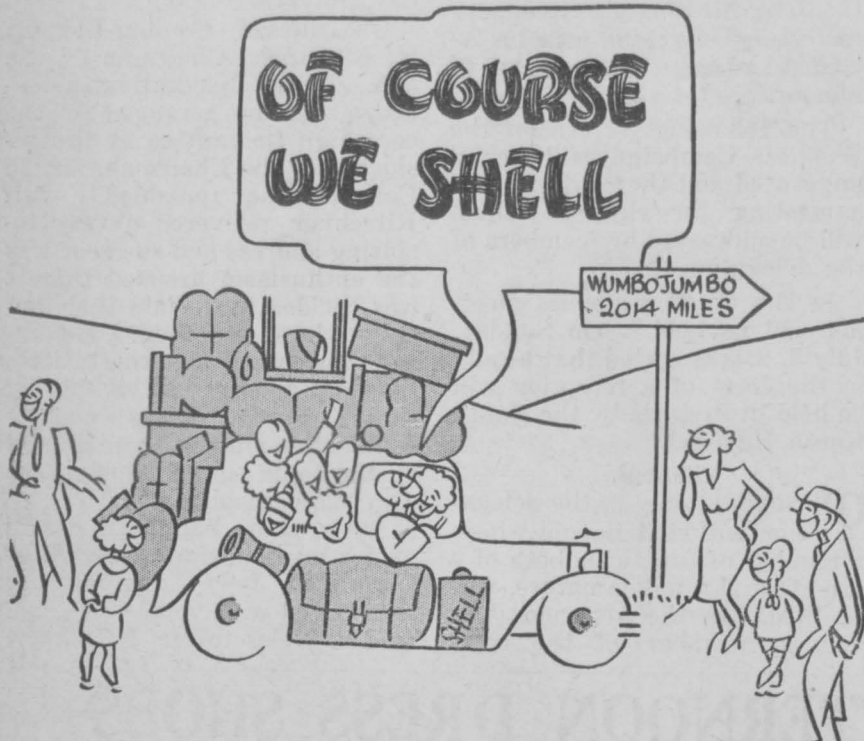
