## MR. DALESKI AT RAND- FONTEIN

Jewish State Party Branch formed

MR. J. DALESKI addressed a large gathering of Zionists at the Town Hall, Randfontein, on Thursday, October 13th.

At a time like this, said Mr. Daleski, when Zionism was in the melting pot, he did not wish to confine his speech to the limits of the Party programme, but he felt he could not rest until the World Executive of the Zionist Organisation adopted the strong national policy preached by the Jewish State Party. When this had been done, he would willingly see the disbanding of the Party.

Mr. Daleski reviewed the international situation and the relationship between the policy of the Chamberlain Government and Palestine. He expressed the opinion that what had happened in Czechoslovakia might well happen in Palestine, and that the Jewish people must now make strong demands and bring pressure to bear on the British Government.

Rev. Goldberg spoke on the lack of strength that had been shown in Zionist policy in the past. The Jewish State Party, he said, had always advocated a strong fighting policy, and were prepared to do so to-day. The Jewish people would never, under any conditions whatsoever, give up their right to Palestine.

The meeting was enthusiastic about the resolution to establish a branch of the Jewish State Party in Randfontein, and a Branch Committee under the chairmanship of Dr. Harry Bloomberg was formed. The committee consists of Rev. Goldberg, Vice-Chairman; Mr. Nathan, Treasurer; Miss Fedler, Secretary; Mrs. Fedler and Miss Yankowitz, committee members.

## PORT ELIZABETH MIZRACHI ORGANISATION

On Tuesday night, the 11th inst., the Mizrachi inaugurated its activities in Port Elizabeth, with a successful function at the Emmanuel Hall. Mr. I. Goss was the chief speaker of the evening. Mr. Dubb, Chairman of the local Mizrachi, who presided, made a plea for unity in Zionist ranks and emphasised the necessity for building our national life in Palestine on the precepts of Judaism and the Torah.

Mr. Goss, in a striking address, deplored the lack of Jewish education and respect for Jewish learning. He condemned those glib critics of Judaism, who were ignorant of all its teachings, and yet went to belittle them. The speaker appealed to the women to effect a revival of the Jewish spirit in the home. The spirit of the Jewish religion, the basis of Jewish life, was being destroyed. A re-emergence of religion was necessary, in the form of a better mode of life and everyday teachings. A better age would come for the Jews, for morning follows the night; the Jews had in the meantime to remain patient and faithful to their traditions and Torah.

During the evening, a piano solo was given by Miss G. Stein. Miss I. Hefferman read two amusing articles, of Jewish interest. Mrs. Aarons, accompanied by Miss Stein sang a Jewish song, while Miss Redhouse contributed delightful violin solos. Miss J. Cohen read a poem by Bialik. During the tea-interval, numerous Hebrew songs were sung.
