Palestine Adopts German Children

All Expectations Exceeded

NAHALAL TAKES 200

Jerusalem, Thursday.

THE Yishuv's readiness to absorb children from Germany exceeds all expectations. The entire two hundred families of Nahalal have each undertaken to adopt a child.

Addressing a women's meeting in Haifa, Rachel Weizmann, the eighty-two year old mother of Dr. Chaim Weizmann, declared that she was adopting three children from Germany. She asked others to follow her example.

In Haifa a drive in this connection has been started and a yellow badge has been distributed with the inscription "Shame Converted into Honour."

A rally was held in Tel-Aviv and it was decided to urge the granting of a quota of 10,000 refugees for Palestine, and to request the immediate admission of the first 50,000.

The Government is still considering the Jewish Agency's request for the admission of 10,000 refugee children into Palestine.

FURTHER CASUALTIES IN PALESTINE

1,556 Killed in Five Months

Jerusalem, Thursday.

CASUALTIES for the months of November are estimated at 197 persons killed and 131 wounded. Of these, 13 Jews were killed and 42 wounded.

It is estimated that for the five months ending 30th November, a total of 1,556 were killed and 1,291 wounded.

During the last week Benjamin Miletzki, Max Heller and Yehuda Papo were killed by terrorists when Jewish workers constructing a road between the Jewish settlements in the Beisan Plain, near Tel Amal, were attacked.

Jewish workers proceeding to the Migdal Zedek quarries were ambushed, and Nathan Goldberg, aged 28, was killed. Three of the workers were wounded, one of them seriously.

Aircraft and troops engaged terrorists, of whom 16 were killed.

DEATH OF BORIS BRUTZKUS Professor at Hebrew University

Jerusalem, Thursday.

THE death has occurred at the age of 64, of Boris Brutzkus, Professor of Agrarian Economics at the Hebrew University.

Further Anti-Jewish Decrees In Germany

Berlin, Thursday.

JEWS have been forbidden to use the Municipal bus services in Göttingen.

Jews may not enter theatres, museums, Exhibition buildings, big meeting halls or bathing places.

They also may not drive motor cars or motor cycles.

Lord Balfour's Nephew Offers Asylum for Refugee Children

London, Thursday.

VISCOUNT TRAPRAIN, a nephew of Lord Balfour, has offered an asylum for 200 Jewish refugee children at his estate near Edinburgh. The children will be given an agricultural training to fit them for Palestine.

Imprisonment for Insulting Jewish Religion

Warsaw, Thursday.

THE editor of the anti-Semitic Calendar, Samoo Brona, has been sentenced by the District Court in Grudzionz, Pomerania, to seven days imprisonment for insulting the Jewish religion by allegations regarding the "immorality" of the Talmud.

Chief Rabbi Moses Shorr and the notorious Jew-baiter, Father Trzeciak, appeared as experts.

NASHASHIBI HOLDS PRESS MEETING

Mufti's Campaign of Terror Criticised

Jerusalem, Thursday.

FAKHRI NASHASHIBI has held a press meeting which was attended by numerous Sheikhs representing 45 villages and 70,000 inhabitants from Jerusalem, Ramallah and the Hebron areas.

The Mufti's campaign of terror was criticised, whilst the wish was expressed that the opposition to the Mufti might be represented at the London discussions.

The speakers suggested the creation of a modified Legislative Council with proportional representation and the stoppage of land sales and immigration. The wish for peace with the British was expressed.

Agriculture Absorbs 20,000 Immigrants During Last Three Years

Jerusalem, Thursday.

DURING the three years of disturbances in Palestine, Jewish agriculture absorbed 20,000 people, 17,000 of whom are new immigrants.

Australia to Admit 15,000 Refugees

Camberra, Thursday.

THE Commonwealth Government has decided to admit 15,000 refugees into Australia in the next three years.

Church Leaders Denounce Anti-Semitism in London

London, Thursday.

THE Archbishop of Canterbury, Cardinal Hinsley and other Church leaders have issued a statement deploring the anti-Jewish feeling in the East End of London, which, they say, is contrary to the spirit and the teaching of Christ.

EVIAN COMMITTEE TO MEET

France to Settle Refugees in Her Colonies?

London, Thursday.

M. Henry Berenger declared at a meeting of Vice-Chairmen of the Inter-Governmental Refugee Bureau that France was prepared to settle in her colonies 10,000 refugees provided Britain and the U.S.A. made a similar effort.

The meeting decided to convene the Evian Refugee Committee in the middle of January.

The Jewish Agency has forwarded a memorandum to the Committee for the admission to Palestine of 100,000 German refugees.

ARAB EXILES TO BE RELEASED

The Palestine Discussions

London, Thursday.

MR. MACDONALD, the Colonial Secretary, stated in the House of Commons that the Arab exiles in the Seychelles were to be released and would be allowed to proceed anywhere except to Palestine.

He declared that the invitations to the Palestine discussions had been accepted by Egypt, Iraq, Saudia, Transjordan and by the Jewish Agency.

Huberman in Palestine Again

BRONISLAW Huberman received a tremendous ovation at his first concert with the Palestine Symphony Orchestra since his accident last year.

Arabs Running Away From Jaffa

Jaffa, Thursday.

ARABS are running away from Jaffa in fear of the terrorists. Most of them are leaving from the Tel Aviv harbour.
