FINAL RECITAL BY ARTHUR RUBINSTEIN

A Brilliant Programme Arranged

At the Colosseum Theatre on Sunday night Arthur Rubinstein, the brilliant and eminent piano virtuoso is giving his last recital here. It is expected that the auditorium of the theatre will be crowded for the occasion.

Rubinstein's programme is a comprehensive one, beginning with the "Moorish Fantasia" by Moszkowski, and ending with a number of short compositions by Villa Lobos, a Brazilian composer who was discovered by Rubinstein in Rio de Janeiro twenty years ago.

The chief item on the programme is the playing of Tschaikowsky's Concerto in B Flat Minor. The visiting artist will be assisted by the S.A. Broadcasting Orchestra, which will be conducted by Mr. Theo Wendt. Mr. Rubinstein will also play the Sonata Op. 53 (Waldstein) by Beethoven, and the Impromptu F Sharp Polonaise Op. 44 by Chopin. Altogether a brilliant programme for a memorable evening.

He also holds the B.Sc. and Ph.D. degrees of the University of Manchester, and has been elected a Fellow of the Royal Society of South Africa.
