Richard Tauber's Recital

Lovers of singing were well rewarded on Sunday night at the Colosseum when Richard Tauber, the eminent tenor, gave the first song recital of his present season. Tauber showed amazing art in his subtle interpretation of a number of Schubert songs. They certainly could not have been sung with finer artistry. The artist was assisted by Mara Losseff, who rendered excerpts from "Land of Smiles" and by Mr. Percy Kahn, who was not only the ideal accompanist, but also rendered a few piano items.

Tauber is due to appear with the Colosseum Orchestra on Sunday, November 12, and the auditorium of the theatre will no doubt be crowded for the occasion. On Sunday evening, November 5, he will give a recital at the Palladium Theatre in Springs.

"The Wizard of Oz" at the Metro
