MARCH has this year been set aside as organisation month by the S.A. Zionist Youth Council. This month will be marked by a comprehensive intensification throughout the country of all aspects of Zionist Youth work. Mass meetings will be held in all centres, at most of which speakers from headquarters in Johannesburg will deliver addresses. Each centre will in addition have membership drives.

The preliminary canvass held in Yeoville, Johannesburg, proved to be an outstanding success. Three hundred people were present at the function held to follow up the canvass and as a result the predominantly Jewish centre of Yeoville will be catered for Zionistically in a far more adequate manner than hitherto.

The outstanding success of this membership drive in a sector of Johannesburg has prompted the Youth Council Organisation Committee to see that such drives are held in other centres too.
