**VOCAL RECITAL BY HUGH MARLEYN**

A large audience of music lovers was present in the ball-room of the Carlton Hotel on Wednesday night when Hugh Marleyn, the well-known London platform artist and interpreter of art songs, gave his first vocal recital here since his arrival some months ago.

There can be no doubt of Mr. Marleyn's superb knowledge of the art of phrasing, musical understanding, experience and gift of vocal control. It was a pleasure to listen to his interpretation of a varied series of songs and operatic excerpts. If his voice has not the full quality, resonance and volume of a younger singer, his sensitive awareness in each instance of the composer's intention, and his remarkable phrasing kept a musically discerning audience interested throughout.

Mr. Marleyn was assisted by Mabel Barnes (Mrs. Charles Saphra), who revealed herself as the possessor of a cultured soprano voice in the rendition of a number of difficult compositions. Mrs. Stanley Anderson's operatic singing was greatly admired and something of a sensation was caused by Miss Thyrsa Vernon, who emerged with considerable credit from the difficult ordeal of rendering the "Bell" aria from the second act of "Lakme" (Delibes). Her voice has a brilliant coloratura quality and there should be a great future for her on the concert and operatic platforms.

Mr. Herman Herz again showed his ability as an unobtrusive but most sympathetic accompanist.
