### BEQUESTS TO CHARITIES

#### The Late Mr. Asher Slotar

Various charities, Jewish and non-Jewish benefit by the will of the late Mr. Asher Slotar, who died in April of this year.

He left £100 each to the Cape Hebrew Congregation, the Cape Jewish Aged Home, the Cape Jewish Orphanage, the Cape Jewish Board of Guardians and the Princess Christian Home.

The will also contains the following clauses:

"To mark my friendship with many Afrikaans-speaking friends, I bequeath £100 to the Kinderzending Huis, Cape Town.

"I also wish to place on record the many pleasant years I spent in Pretoria, and in consequence I desire that my name be associated with that town. I therefore bequeath the sum of £150 to the Pretoria Hospital to endow a bed to be known as the Asher Slotar Bed in the children's ward and £100 to the Louis Botha Orphanage, Pretoria.

### SUCCESSFUL CONCERT AT DUNCAN HALL

THE concert held in aid of the Jewish National Fund last Sunday night at Duncan Hall, Johannesburg, proved a great success. Great credit is due to the organiser, Miss Dolly Weinbrenn, F.T.C.L., U.L.M., for getting together so fine a galaxy of artists. Unfortunately Mr. Eugen Magid, the well-known violinist, was unable to appear, and although Miss Margaret Fairless volunteered to play in his place, this fine artist was also prevented at the last moment from appearing.

The function was under the auspices of the Mayfair-Booysens Branch of the Johannesburg Women's Zionist League. There was a large audience present. Mr. Bruno Raikin contributed several well-known pianoforte solos. Mr. John Allen who recently distinguished himself as the tenor in the performance of "Faust" at the Empire Theatre, sang several arias. Miss Lila Emdin sang delightfully and Miss Olwen Whiley pleased the audience with a number of dances. The rich voice of Miss Jean Gluckmann was heard to advantage and Miss Sussanah Owens recited well.
