A Social Afternoon for Women Workers Successful Function at Langham Hotel

THERE was a good attendance at a social afternoon for workers held at the Langham Hotel last Tuesday afternoon, under the auspices of the Johannesburg Women's Zionist League. It was the last meeting of the League to be held this year, and it proved both an interesting and enjoyable function.

Mrs. A. Franks, who presided, urged all present to voice any criticisms or suggestions for future work. A brisk discussion ensued, in which representatives from all branches took part, and many grievances and recommendations for the future conduct of the branches were thrashed out. Mrs. L. Joffe, the treasurer, warned branch treasurers of the dangers of slackness in the keeping of their books, and her remarks were endorsed both by the chair and by members of committees of other branches.

Dr. D. Katzen spoke briefly on the Palestine section of the Liberty Cavalcade, explaining its objects and urging all present to enrol themselves as workers for it. She emphasised, however, that no work should be done at the expense of the League, and her remarks were endorsed by Mrs. Franks.

Presentations of trees, both from the Hillbrow branch and from the Central Executive were made to Mrs. R. Melzer, Chairman of the Hillbrow branch, on the occasion of her departure for Capetown. Mrs. Melzer expressed her thanks and appreciation.

After tea, two playlets, produced by Mrs. T. Kushlick, were given. The first, a propaganda play on the correct approach to various types of women outside Zionism, won ripples of appreciative laughter from an audience only too experienced in that line of work. The second play dealt with "A quiet day in the life of any Zionist President," and must have struck a responsive chord in the hearts of many present. Both plays were greatly enjoyed and warmly applauded, and Mrs. Kushlick was presented with a small token of appreciation of her work.

PALESTINE SECTION OF LIBERTY CAVALCADE Many Functions Planned

"Victory" at Plaza
