Forthcoming Conference of Eastern Province Zionists

Arrangements for the conference of Eastern Province Zionists in Grahamstown on 24th-25th May are now nearing completion, and an appeal is made to all organised Zionist groups and interested workers to make every effort to co-operate in assuring its success.

SOCIETIES are urged to send as many representatives as possible, and interested Zionists in all parts of the Province, from every village and hamlet, are invited to participate. There will be no fees, and no restrictions as to number. Those who wish to attend are, however, requested to submit their names to the Organiser-Secretary, E. P. Zionist Council, P.O. Box 631, Port Elizabeth, before the 30th May.

This conference, the last of a series of provincial conferences that have been held in recent months in the Transvaal, O.F.S., and Eastern Cape, has been called, like its predecessors, to discuss the problems of organisation which confront the movement in South Africa. The great distances, poor communications, and smallness of most communities aggravate these problems in the Eastern Province.

In an attempt to cope with these difficulties, and to intensify Zionist work and feeling, the S.A. Zionist Federation some nine months ago embarked upon the experiment of establishing a regional office in Port Elizabeth. Mr. S. Berg was ap-

pointed as the official in charge and a temporary council under the chairmanship of Mr. N. E. Rosenberg assumed the directive control. The council has established contact with many centres in the Province. And, especially in Port Elizabeth and its closer neighbourhood, has achieved a considerable amount of success. Mr. closer neighbourhood, has achieved a considerable amount of success. Mr. Rosenberg, recently retiring from the chair on account of pressure of work, has been succeeded by Mr. Smulian. South Africans Hear Palestine Orchestra

"The undersigned also had the pleasure of meeting the South African Generals—Major-General Brink and Major-General Theron—both of whom spoke enthusiastically about the Orchestra and the work it is doing in providing entertainment for the troops."
