PALESTINE SECTION OF LIBERTY CAVALCADE


Fourteen Attractive Stalls

- (10) Joyland, where wonderful toys will be on sale, and a delightful creche in a "Mother Goose" setting will provide jolly amusements and expert attention for the children of sight-seers and workers.
- (11) Cafetaria, where excellent meals can be obtained with dispatch in dainty servings.
- (12) Hot Snack Stall, which will specialise in hot dogs and hot beef sandwiches.
- (13) Games Stall, where every form of amusement from simple di-versions to complicated trials of skill will tempt the onlooker and the sportsman.
- (14) Palestine Products, where articles of all kinds made in Palestine from Palestinian raw materials and with Palestinian labour both in handcraft and in manufactured goods, will be on view and for sale.

SERVICES CLUB IN PALESTINE


