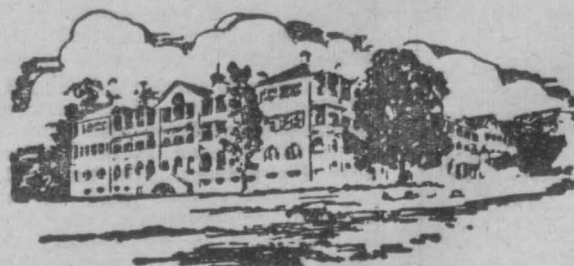

WOMEN URGED TO JOIN UNION DEFENCE FORCES

URGENT APPEAL MADE BY COLONEL WERDMULLER

"OUR soldiers cannot fight alone," said Colonel G. C. G. Werdmuller, the Director for Recruiting, recently. "Unless the men at the front have adequate support at the base their sacrifices are in vain. The women of South Africa can give them that support by joining the W.A.A.S. or the W.A.A.F. They must stand by their men. Thousands are already on the job, but thousands more are needed to free the men who are tied down to base offices."

The decision of the Union Defence Department to enlist the services of women in anti-aircraft and search-light batteries has brought the "ack-ack" very much into the news recently. The greatest importance has been attached to adequate "ack-ack" defences for the Union coast towns and aerodromes. This country is following the scheme in Britain where the use of women to operate the sensitive dials of the fire control instruments in anti-aircraft batteries has been a notable success.

Women are also wanted as welders, painters, electricians, fitters for aeroplane engines, carpenters, instrument makers, radio mechanics, parachute packers, canteen workers, clerical workers, transport drivers and many other kinds of war work.

An Inspiration To The Men.

The zeal with which many women have taken to war work has been an inspiration to their menfolk, who, determined not to be outdone, have shown their desire to pull their weight in this all-in war by going on active service. More inspiration, however, is needed.

Jewish women have been renowned for the way they stood by their men throughout the centuries of struggle for Jewish freedom. To-day, more than ever before, the Jewish cause is in the balance. Jewish men and Jewish women have rallied to the fight against Hitlerism and the concentration camp regime it stands for. But an even greater effort is needed.
