



Mr. N. Englesberg "Chronicle" Seaside Addresses Youth. Camp.

Mr. N. Englesberg, the newly appointed travelling propagandist of the S.A. Zionist Federation, addressed a youth meeting at the Zionist Hall on Thursday, 11th inst.

Mr. A. Roberts was in the chair and extended a cordial welcome to Mr. Englesberg.

Mr. Hirschman, of Johannesburg, extended greetings on behalf of the S.A. Zionist Youth Council, and appealed to the Youth to show their confidence in the Zionist Organisation.

Mr. Englesberg described the development of Palestine from every angle during recent years and said that the Jews had succeeded in proving to the world that they could colonise as well as, if not better than other countries. Not only had the number of colonies grown enormously, but the spirit of the Chalutzim was such as to rouse the admiration of the whole world. Mr. Englesberg gave a graphic description of a number of settlements, particularly the newer ones and showed how the Chalutzim did not know the meaning of fear and were determined to carry on in spite of all obstacles.

In urban and municipal development the Jewish People in Palestine had also shown themselves remarkably capable. Cultural progress was phenomenal, and the Hebrew University was important not only because of the inspiration it gave to the Jews but because of the benefits that would be derived from it by the whole world.

What has been achieved in Palestine has strengthened the backs of Jewry in the Galut; it has given a new self-respect even to Zionists, and also made it possible for Jews to be better citizens of the country in which they live. During the last 18 months the economic position of Palestine had become worse; but nevertheless the unemployment was not of the same extent that it would have been if the National Home had not been established on a sound basis.

Mr. Englesberg appealed to the Jewish Youth to take an active part in the Zionist Organisation. Not only must they give their financial support but also their moral support. Because of the anti-Semitism that exists throughout the world, it was essential that every Jew should belong to the Zionist Organisation. The solution of the Jewish problem lay only in Palestine.

Referring to partition, Mr. Englesberg said that there was room in the Zionist Organisation for all shades of opinion. No one was prevented from stating his views. "But," he added, "we have no room for destructive forces. We cannot allow anybody to destroy the work that has been built up by hard Jewish toil."

Mr. Roberts proposed a hearty vote of thanks to Mr. Englesberg for his inspiring address.

George Zionist Society.

For the past three years the Oudtshoorn Jewish Guild and the George Zionist Society have been holding Inter-Functions, at Oudtshoorn and George alternately. On Sunday, the 7th inst., the local Zionist Society was host to the Guild and to numerous visitors from Cape Town, Mossel Bay and elsewhere.

Mr. S. Miller, Chairman of the Society, presided over the large gathering and after he had welcomed all the visitors the social programme was proceeded with. Rev. I. Wolk, of George, sang two Yiddish songs which were excellently rendered. Thereafter Mr. Immelman gave a most interesting lecture on "The Life of a True Citizen" and this was followed by two songs by Mrs. S. Joseph, of George. These items were heartily applauded. Mr. David Segal, of George, then gave his customary news-reel.

An interval for refreshments preceded the Inter-Debate. Mr. S. Miller, for George, moved "That Partitoin be accepted," the motion being opposed by Mr. S. Lison, for Oudtshoorn. After a thorough discussion the motion was defeated by an overwhelmingly majority.

In a speech of thanks, Mr. Victor Aschman, Chairman of the Oudtshoorn Jewish Guild, expressed his Guild's thanks for the hospitality of the George Zionist Society, and emphasised the binding nature of these Inter-Functions on Jewry in the South-Western Districts.
