TO TAKE PLACE NEXT TUESDAY.

On Tuesday next, January 10th, at 11 a.m., Rabbi Israel Abrahams will declare open the Holiday Fair to be held at the Muizenberg Pavilion to aid the Jewish National Fund. The Fair is being held under the auspices of the Bnoth Zion, and every branch associated with the Bnoth Zion has undertaken a stall. A great variety of merchandise will be on sale, ranging from hand-made children's garments and baby clothes to groceries, provisions and sweets. There will be many side-shows and entertainments including an amusing post office. At 3.30 p.m. sharp there will be a splendid children's entertainment to be contributed by Rodrigues, the man of magic, and Margaret Dreyer (soprano). At night the Pavilion will be transformed into a Sporting Arena, and a very special sporting feature will be the main item in the evening programme, which will be greatly enjoyed by young and old. Although the Holiday Fair will not be officially opened until 11 a.m. on Tuesday next, visitors can enter the Pavilion from 10 a.m., and the fun will be continuous until midnight. All Jewish visitors to Muizenberg and Cape Town are cordially invited to attend the Holiday Fair at Muizenberg Pavilion on Tuesday next. The Fair will be open from 10 a.m. till midnight.
