Latest Cables

The Situation in Palestine.

Jerusalem.

Five thousand Jews assembled at the Wailing Wall for service on Tisha Be'av. Among the worshippers were Mr. Shertok, head of the Political Department of the Jewish Agency and Mr. Ben Zvi, head of the Vaad Leumi. Heavy police detachments searched the Jews for arms as they entered the Jaffa Gate.

Abraham Zelinger, a Jewish police corporal was seriously injured when a landmine exploded near Yagur.

Michael Adlen (46), a veteran of the Jewish legion, was shot dead in an orange grove near Kinereth. Later three Arabs were found shot dead.

Five Arabs were killed and eight wounded in eight different shooting incidents in and around Tel-Aviv, Rehoboth, and Petah Tikvah. Traffic was suspended in the three towns.

One hundred and thirty-eight Arabs were arrested by troops and police in the course of a major clean-up of the suburbs of Haifa and Acre.

Another New Settlement.

Fifty graduates and employees of Mikve Israel Agricultural School established a new settlement Kfar Netter, near Nathania.

Refugee Conference.

London.

The British Government has accepted President Roosevelt's invitation to Washingto discuss the refugee situation and will be represented by Lord Winterton.

Jewish Emigration from Czech Protectorate.

Prague.

A central Jewish emigration office under the direction of the Gestapo has been opened in Prague. This is taken as indicating a change in the Jewish emigration policy since hiterto thousands of Jews were not allowed to leave the Procterate.

Jewish Doctors in Slovakia.

London.

The number of Jewish doctors allowed to practise in Slovakia will be limited to four per cent. of the total number of physicians registered in Slovakia on June 30th, this year, according to a new decree. About 600 doctors will be affected by the decree.

The Minster of Justice has announced the drafting of a new decree by which Slovak and German debtors to Jews will be granted a moratorium.

Action against French Anti-Semitic Publications.

Paris.

Action has been taken against anti-Semitic publications in France. Darquier de Pellepoix, editor of La France Enchainée, who is also a member of the Paris Municipal Council, has been charged on an allegation of having violated a decree against incitement to racial hatred.

Jewish Composers on "Black List" in Italy.

Rome.

The sale of light music by Jewish composers both in the form of gramophone records and printed scores is to be banned in Italy.

At the instigation of Signor Alfieri, Minister for Popular Culture, a "black list" of works and composers is being prepared by the "commission for the increase and discipline of the Italian fight for music."

Paris.

It is reliably reported that the Gestapo is allowing a delegation of German and Austrian Zionists to participate in the forthcoming Congress at Geneva.

Brussels.

The Government has decided to carry out a census of foreigners in Belgium, in order to estimate the part foreigners are playing in the economic and social life of the country and to reveal the number of illegal residents.

Warsaw.

Two hundred Jewish families have been rendered homeless by a fire in the Grabowiec province of Lublin.
