stitute the delegation: Mrs. I. Benishowitz, Messrs. Z. Avin, Ch. Achron, E. Kluk, B. Padowich and G. Telem.

The evening was devoted to a discussion on "The Party and local Jewish Problems." Mr. E. Kluk in initiating the discussion dealt with the characteristics of South African Zionism, which had mainly distinguished itself in individual effort and enthusiasm. That was fundamentally due to the lack of a real Zionist education and a proper knowledge of Palestinian problems. Zionist propaganda had been mainly of a type which appealed more to the sentiments than intellect of the Jewish masses. That was a weakness which made it possible for passing discouragements to jeopardise the work of Zionist constructive effort and provide a footing for the growth of various adverse elements. Mr. Kluk deplored the absence of a spontaneous Chalutz movement in this country. He felt that the crux of the whole problem was the absence of a modern Jewish national education system and made an appeal for the establishment of a Hebrew day school and model afternoon school. In conclusion he touched on the work of the Board of Deputies in relation to the local situation and felt that more attention should be paid by Zionists in that direction.

An interesting discussion followed in which Messrs. G. Telem, Ch. Achron, B. Preiss, B. Padowich and H. Barnett participated. Mr. Kluk replied to the discussion.

The Chairman commented on the rapid growth of the Zionist Socialist Party during the last few months, and called for more intensive individual effort from those present.
