Dr. LOUIS P. BOSMAN.

At the fortnightly Conversazione held at the Zionist Hall on Tuesday night, Dr. Louis P. Bosman gave a fascinating lecture on "Blood and Race." While dealing with the subject of blood-grouping scientifically, his explanations were so clear and interesting that he held the audience spell-bound throughout the evening and his practical illustrations were followed with the closest attention. He also dealt with the medico-legal side of this absorbing subject, and quoted a number of legal actions in which the paternity of a child was in question and in which medical evidence as to the group of blood to which a person belonged was the decisive factor.

Blood-transfusion was dependent on blood-grouping, said Dr. Bosman, and the "universal donor" could give his blood to anyone.

As regards the question of race, said Dr. Bosman, there was no scientific evidence to prove that there was any difference in the blood of different races. There was no superiority or inferiority of blood. The Aryan theory of race had not been proved scientifically.

Dr. S. E. Kark was in the chair, and Dr. I. M. Hurwitz proposed a vote of thanks to Dr. Bosman.
