A Farewell at Stellenbosch.

On Sunday, the 8th September, a reception was given jointly by the Stellenbosch Young Israel Society and the Hebrew Congregation to bid au revoir to Gunner Solly Chideckel and Corporal Eddy Segall on the eve of their departure for the North on active service. Miss Heather Shulman was in the chair. Rev. Reichenberg wished them "God speed" and a safe passage through the perils of the war. Other speakers of the evening were Mr. S. Joffe, Mr. J. Shulman, Mrs. Senitzky, Mr. A. Senitzky and Mr. M. Werb, Chairman of the Y.I. Society.

Due tributes were paid by the speakers to the sterling qualities of the departing soldiers, and of the good work they had done for Jewish causes, for the Stellenbosch Young Israel Society and for the whole of the community generally. Miss Shulman then presented Corporal Segall and Gunner Chideckel with a set of "Machzeirim." A song of good wishes—"Shalom Aleichem," was then sung by the gathering, the music being provided by Miss Lorna Friedman. After the tea interval, the two members suitably replied, after which dancing followed.

Reported Missing.

Pilot-Officer Gerald Mark Goodman, aged twenty-two, of Johannesburg, who joined the R.A.F. in June, 1939, is reported missing as the result of an air accident on September 13th. His parents have received notification to this effect from the British Air Ministry. Pilot-Officer Goodman was educated at the Parktown High School. He is a nephew of Mr. I. M. Goodman, of Cape Town.

Lionel Bowman to Play at Symphony Concert.

Mr. Lionel Bowman, who recently returned to Cape Town from London, will be the soloist at the Symphony Concert in the City Hall on Thursday, 26th September, when he will play the Concerto in E Flat Major by Liszt. Although he has broadcast since his return this will be his first big musical performance.

Mr. Bowman had a very successful three years in London. During his period of study at the Royal Academy of Music there he has played three Concertos with Sir Henry Wood as conductor, one of which was a concerto in F Major by St. Saens which, Sir Henry informed Mr. Bowman he had only once previously conducted and it was then played by St. Saens himself. He also won many awards among which was the Mathew Phillimore prize, the Roller Memorial prize for the best performance of a work by Beethoven, and that most coveted prize the Chappell Gold Medal.
