When Mr. Kentridge, M.P., visited Nairobi recently, he expressed surprise that there was no Young Jewish Club in existence. It was pointed out to him that, owing to the war, the Jewish population of Nairobi, which in normal times was small, at present is very scattered.

However, his words did not fall on deaf ears. Immediately after his departure, Mr. Franklin a member of H.M. Forces made it his business to contact the younger members of the civilian population, as well as various members of H.M. Forces, and invited them to attend a meeting with the idea of forming a club. Everyone present approved of the suggestion, and elected a committee which consists of three members of H.M. Forces, six civilians, and one soldier from the United States.

The Club's main idea is to further the knowledge of its members in regard to Jewish history and culture. It also embodies the social side. It has at present a dramatic section and musical section, and also a section catering for lessons in modern Hebrew. It is hoped at a later date to start a Zionist section.

The committee meets regularly once a week to arrange in advance the procedure for the gatherings. In spite of difficulties in connection with accommodation and transport, the energetic officers of the committee have successfully called three gatherings in the last three weeks, which have had both a social and cultural atmosphere.

The membership is now 65, and those who know Nairobi under war-time conditions will realise what a splendid number this is.

Kurt Jonas Memorial Scholarship.

TO BE ESTABLISHED BY S.A. STUDENTS.

The South African Student Zionist Commission (which acts as a Committee of the Youth Council) has decided to establish a Kurt Jonas Memorial Scholarship at the Hebrew University. It has long been felt that there should be a connecting link between the Jewish students of this country and the Hebrew University. The decision to establish this scholarship represents an important step in this direction.

The scholarship will be open to students—preferably from South Africa—who wish to proceed to the Hebrew University in order to equip themselves for Jewish national or communal service. It is expected that the first award will be made at the end of 1944 and further awards will be made at periodic intervals.

The decision to establish such scholarship has been enthusiastically welcomed by the Zionist students at the Witwatersrand and Cape Town Universities, and they have already undertaken to raise specified amounts within the next two years.

Any persons who wish to contribute to the scholarship fund should kindly communicate with the Secretary of the S.A. Zionist Youth Council, P.O. Box 18, Johannesburg.

It has been further decided that the scholarship should commemorate the memory of Kurt Jonas, the brilliant young South African Zionist whose death in February, 1942, was widely mourned. Kurt Jonas, who was keenly interested in the development of Student Zionism, was a student at both the Witwatersrand and Hebrew Universities, and it is highly appropriate that the scholarship should be in his name.

The establishment of this scholarship has been cordially welcomed by the Hebrew University authorities.
