

## Zionist Youth Activities.

Number of societies were visited by the active during the past week in connection Pesach celebrations. A report of the singing of junior societies in Cape Town is below, and details of functions at Sea Worcester and elsewhere will be published later.

Members of the **Hanoar Hamizrachi**, **Z.S.** and **Jewish Children's League** (Junior Section) were present at "Rosecourt" Thursday night, April 22nd. Mr. H. H. was in the chair. The first half of the evening was devoted to a humorous news presentation in which the items all related to Passover incidents. After refreshments an address was given by Mr. S. M. on the significance of Pesach.

"Open Forum" held by the **Cape Town Youth Society** proved to be the most and most instructive meeting held in months. There was the usual singing of songs at the beginning, and then questions for discussion were handed out.
