he really suffered a setback because he had
not been proud of his Jewish origin. He de-
cried "those cowards who went out of their
way to deny their Judaism." He said that
he had found that those who forsook the tradi-
tions of Jewry were generally those who were
unprincipled and as a result were never re-
spected by the Gentile world.

Mr. Gradner congratulated the Circle on its
achievements and wished them every success
for the future.
