COLOSSEUM.

"The Bells Go Down," now at the Colosseum with Tommy Trinder in one of the principal roles, is a worthy successor to "The Foreman Went to France." The film was made with the full co-operation of the British Fire Service and is a tribute to the men and women of the service whose unflinching devotion to duty during the London Blitz of 1940-41 saved their city. It is based on the published diary of an unnamed fireman and describes the adventures, the romance and the courage of an East End A.F.S. member under fire. Tommy Trinder plays the part of a Cockney fireman.

ROYAL.

Clark Carter again fares forth on romance and adventure bent in the person of Walter Carter in "Sky Murder," third of the popular detective series, which opens at the Royal on Monday. His quest for adventure has him walking an airplane wing, clinging on a careening truck, saving a girl from a bomb, and other thrills. His quest for romance leads him into hilarious complications as the result of his flirtations. The film deals with his tracking down of a band of international criminals plotting against the Government, and running down its secret plans. There is a fine supporting cast.

ODEON and CURZON.

The current show at the Odeon Theatre, Sea Point, and the Curzon Theatre, Wynberg, is a great screen event. 20th Century-Fox's "Tales of Manhattan" took two years to make and employed ten screen writers to tell a story that is as brilliant as it is unique. It concerns a tail-coat and the story of drama, comedy, music, romance and action. The cost of the production is

estimated at roughly £9,000,000 and features 44 screen personalities, among them Charles Boyer, Henry Fonda, Rita Hayworth, Chas. Laughton, Ginger Rogers, George Sanders, Edward G. Robinson, and many others. In conjunction with this film, a "Masked Star" contest is being held and a display is on exhibition in the C.T.C. Bazaar's window.

Fay Bainter plays one of the leading dramatic roles in William Saroyan's "The Human Comedy," now showing at the Plaza Theatre with a cast of many of Metro-Goldwyn-Mayer's top-flight players.
