

Zionist Youth Activities.

The Cape Zionist Youth Executive wishes to announce that an Oneg Shabbat is being arranged for Friday, 28th April, at 8 p.m., at the Zionist Hall. Mr. Joshua Leibner will be the guest speaker and items will be provided. Societies are urged to attend this important Oneg Shabbat.

Close on 100 people attended a Seder Evening held by the Muizenberg Young Israel Society at the Talmud Torah Hall, Muizenberg, on 9th April. Representatives of Chavurah Lezion, Zionist Socialist Youth and the Muizenberg B.G.O.Z.S., as well as many seniors, were present. After the enthusiastic singing of Hebrew songs, two young members, Miss G. Lemonsky and Miss N. Berman, asked the four questions. Mr. J. G. Borok ably replied to the first, "Why is Pesach ranked among the foremost Jewish national festivals?" and Mr. M. Singer's reply to the second question, "What are your ideas on post-war reconstruction?" was both interesting and comprehensive. Then Miss M. Sher, Miss A. Weinreich and Mr. B. Futeran spoke on the communal settlements found in Eretz Israel, and Mr. A. Berman answered the four questions of the Haggadah with an original humorous poem.

Two members of a Palestine kibbutz then gave an account of how Pesach is celebrated in Eretz Israel and answered questions on the subject. Adv. J. Herstein gave a short talk, and after refreshments were served, Miss A. Weinreich sang two songs. A play was then presented by the dramatic section, and the meeting closed with Hatikvah.

The Zionist Socialist Youth group at their meeting on Friday, 14th inst., paid tribute to the revolt of the Jews in the ghetto of Warsaw, it being the first anniversary of that gallant stand made by a few Jews against the Nazi power. After a few announcements, Chaver Colin Legum addressed the meeting. He said that he was glad to see that the spirit necessary for any Zionist group was present. He then went on to explain how it is that people like himself and others turned to Zionist Socialism as the solution of the Jewish problem. We must not follow any ideologies blindly, but must understand its implications, and Zionist Socialism gives one the opportunity to have differences of opinion because it is not an ideology which forces rigidity of mind. The only dogma of Zionist Socialism is the complete synthesis of both ideals—Zionism and Socialism. We are Socialists because we revolt against the inequalities of the Capitalist system, but we are something more than just Socialist because the abnormality of the Jewish nation cannot be overcome by the improvement of general conditions only. In Russia it was found necessary

to create an autonomous state for the Jews even after the overthrow of Capitalism, which proves that even under Communism it is essential that we have an autonomous Jewish State. International co-operation is the pre-requisite of world Socialism, but before we can have healthy international relations we must have healthy productive nations. Quoting Herzl, he said, "Palestine can only be rebuilt under the banner of Labour." Turning to the political aspect, he said we would not be able to get Palestine as our national homeland unless we win in the political sphere, and through an influence in the Labour movements we could get effective results. After some discussion, the meeting closed with the singing of Techezaknah and dancing of the Hora and other Palestinian dances.

The last meeting of the Oudtshoorn I.Y.S. was held in the Hebrew School Hall on Sunday, 25th March. Mr. I. Barron was in the chair and there were 17 members present. The Secretary read the minutes of the previous meeting which were duly confirmed. The news service was read by Mr. Natie Miller, after which followed an interesting talk on "Purim" by Mr. Boris Friedland. The ten questions were asked by Mr. Barney Miller. Then followed a very lively hat debate. Miss Sally Klass rendered a piano solo which was much enjoyed, and after a few minutes of lively heckling the meeting concluded with the singing of Hatikvah.

At the weekly meeting of the Sea Point group of the Zionist Socialist Youth on Sunday, 16th inst., Chaver Barney Singer took the chair. The meeting opened with community singing, after which Chaver Merton Walters read an extract from a letter received from Chavera Phyllys Rabkin, of Johannesburg, conveying congratulations from the Central Committee on the progress of the Sea Point group. Chaver Bennie Melmed gave a resume of the events of the past week, in particular Mr. Louw's speech in the House of Assembly, and the recent arrival of Dr. von Weisl. Chaver Melmed then asked members to give their views as to which type of music was of greater value to human society—jazz or classical. The majority of the speakers felt that classical music, especially light classical music, had a greater attraction than jazz for most people. The meeting closed with the singing of Techezaknah. The next meeting will be held on Sunday, 23rd inst., at 7.45 p.m. at the Talmud Torah Hall, Marais Road, Sea Point, when Chaver E. Kluk will deliver an address.
