

Zionist Youth Activities.

The **Cape Zionist Youth Executive**, in launching a popular arrangement with the Zionist Hall Library, wishes to open a store room of knowledge to members of Zionist Youth. The Executive, by paying an annual affiliation to the Library, enables all authorised members of societies to borrow the books out of the library free of charge, while all those who have entered for the Fellowship scheme will forego the necessity of a deposit, provided such a person guarantees to return the book in good condition. A list of books contained in the Zionist Library will be sent out to all societies shortly, as well as details of the arrangements made. (In the meantime no one is yet authorised to borrow books under the Executive plan.)

A Broadcast play, entitled "Yesterday and To-morrow," was next acted. Sidney Michalowsky lectured on "Racial Problems in Eretz Israel." He dealt mainly with the Arab problem from the internal and external points of view. He discussed the conditions of the

Arabs in Eretz Israel since the arrival of the Jews. An interesting discussion ensued. In conclusion, an article entitled "Justice for My People" was read by Lulu Newstead.

A meeting of the **Oudtshoorn Y.I.S.** was held in the Hebrew School Hall on Sunday, 2nd July. Mr. Bennie Miller presided and there was an attendance of over sixty including a number of visitors.
