Arthur was Segan Ba-Koach in the Cape Province and was loved by all members of Habonim and Zionist youth. He enlisted at the beginning of the war and was taken prisoner at Tobruk and spent about three years as prisoner of war in Germany. This is really great news for Habonim in this Province and they are looking forward to his very early return to Cape Town. They extend hearty congratulations to his family.

Letters to Men on Active Service.

When writing to members of the African forces who are serving outside the Union it is necessary for the sender to put his, or her, name on the back of his, or her, air-mail letter cards. This greatly facilitates the return of mail to the Union. When a soldier has returned to South Africa and the correspondence reaches the theatre where the volunteer was serving, the batches of men return after a tour of duty and the army postal authorities do a great deal of unnecessary work in copying and redirecting them back to the Union. This practice of putting the sender's name on the backs of envelopes is especially important in the case of a large-scale movement of South African troops after the conclusion of hostilities in Europe.
