

Miss Hedy Haas excels in two outstanding characteristics: she can penetrate into the depths of one's soul and the workings thereof, and can bring out whatever is most characteristic, by her fine artistic form. With her secret of accuracy and restraint she captures the hearts of all who and restraint she captures the hearts of all who attend her concerts. She has the gift of em-phasising the essential in her types, without the unnecessary exaggeration which can so easily spoil a desired impression, and can convert a natural characterisation to one of ridicule and absurdite. absurdity.

In Miss Haas's last concert which took place at the Muizenberg Pavilion on 22nd January, she enacted the "Web of Jewish Life." Her living pictures of the way of life of the Jews in Europe touched the hearts of those who were familiar with this life, as well as of those who did not know it. Miss Haas gave us pure art, such as we seldom see on the stage to-day. She portrayed the enthusiasm and yearning of the Chassidim at the expected approach of their Rebbe; she next became a Jewish mother, cradling her son to sleep with a lullaby; she enacted the drunk Jew of the ghetto—all of them types, diametrically opposite to one another, and all performed with outstand-ing talent. ing talent.

In "Der Gilgul Fun a Nigun" Miss Haas de-scribes the fate of the Jewish Nigun which wan-ders, like its owner, from diaspora to diaspora. In this Miss Haas reached the climax of her art, and was loudly acclaimed by an audience who had been deeply moved.

had been deeply moved. The Jewish community should be well aware of the great artist it has in its midst, and appre-ciate her accordingly. It is hoped that Miss Haas will delight us with many more of her characterisations of Jewish life. Miss Vera Poppe ('cellist) and Mr. Walter Morgan (accompanist and accordianist) also ap-peared during the evening and helped to make this councert a great success.


ALHAMBRA.
