## Triumph for Sigi Weissenberg.

Sigi Weissenberg, the 16-year-old pianist, scored a great triumph when he gave his first recital in Cape. Town on Tuesday night at the City Hall,

The programme opened with Bach's Italian Concerto, in which Weissenberg immediately revealed himself as a mature artist of high rank. In his interpretation of this unique work he displayed outstanding technical qualities and sound musicianship. Liszt's Sonata in B Minor followed and he gave a magnificent performance, leaving a profound impression.

After the interval Weissenbrg played Claire de Lune by Debussy, Nocturno (for the left hand only) by Scriabine, the Flight of the Bumble bee by Rimski-Korsakov and Triana by Albeniz. Each of these items, so different in subject and style, was exquisitely played and left little to be beginning.

Weissenberg received a tremendous ovation and played several encores, including the charming little Liadov "Musical Box."

The second and final concert by Sigi Weissenberg will be given in the City Hall on Tuesday next, for which he has chosen a variety of different works, chief among them being Chopin's "Sonata in B Minor, Op. 3." Another item of special interest is "Humoresque' by Wladigeroff, his old teacher in Bulgaria before the war.

In addition the programme includes "Sonata in E Flat Major (Haydn), Prelude Fuge and Variation (Cesar Franck), two Studies by Scriabine, the first in D Flat Major and the second in D Sharp Minor, and finally Prokofieff's "Suggestion Diabolique," Opus No. 4.
