### Paul Loyonnet.

A large audience on Wednesday night was enchanted by the playing of one of France's greatest pianists, Paul Loyonnet. In an exciting and varied programme Loyonnet proved his virtuosity and carried his audience with him. The Bach Caprice, which opened the programme, was played with control and a clear interpretation of each changing movement.

Among the other items of a delightful programme was the Scarlatti Sonata, which, in response to thunderous applause, had to be repeated, as also did one of the Chopin waltzes. His Chopin, to my mind, was the highlight of the programme.

The Beethoven A flat Sonata struck a sombre but satisfactory note and was the great work of the evening.

The romantic note in the second half of the programme gave free play for Loyonnet's remarkable virtuosity and restraint. Two Liszt pieces closed the programme, but Loyonnet was brought back twice and smilingly gave the audience the exciting "Erl King" and Chopin's Raindrop study.

Saturday night's programme with the Municipal Orchestra, Beethoven's Concerto in C minor being the main work, should bring all music lovers to the City Hall.

### Enjoyable Concert in City Hall.

The concert arranged by the Bnoth Zion Association in connection with Wizo Month which took place in the City Hall on Monday night was very successful and the funds for the erection of a Mothercraft Training Centre and Baby Home in Tel Aviv should be considerably augmented by the proceeds.

The programme presented was an excellent one and the artists who participated are deserving of high praise. Monya Mindlin (accompanied by Helga Bassel) gave a number of violin solos, including "Hebrew Dance" by Zimbalist; he played with feeling and understanding and made a deep impression. Harry Rabinowitz was in excellent form; among the songs he rendered (accompanied by Miss Rachel Rabinowitz) was "Omrim, Yesh Na Eretz" by Engel, and as an encore "Mein Shtettele Belz," which was enthusiastically received. Miss Joyce Kadish gave a beautiful performance of Beethoven's "Moonlight" Sonata; in the second part of the programme she played "Scherzo" by Mendelssohn, Nocturne in F. sharp major by Chopin, and Fileuses prés de Carantec by Rhené-Baton; she was received with much applause and gave an encore.

The concert was greatly enjoyed by all present and appreciation is due to all those responsible for its arrangement. Mr. Leonard Schach was the stage manager. Members of the Massadah Association, with Mr. J. Hanson at the head, acted as ushers.

### PLAZA.

At this time of the year it is certainly exceptional for a picture to run three weeks and still attract crowded houses. "The Green Years" is enjoying this distinction at the Plaza. The next attraction will be "Boys' Ranch" which is another big production and is somewhat similar in theme and treatment to that popular film "Boys' Town." Another big picture is "Easy to Wed" with Van Johnson, Esther Williams and musical cast. It is in technicolor.

### COLOSSEUM.
