Cape Town Zionist Youth Society.—A well-attended meeting was held at the residence of Miss S. Nurok on Friday, 20th September. The guest speaker was Mr. G. Wilk, who delivered a most interesting lecture on the towns of Eretz Israel. He described the life of the Jewish communities in Haifa, Tel Aviv and Jerusalem. Mr. Wilk had visited Palestine before the war and spoke with intimacy of the daily routine in these towns. Miss T. Schach read the news service, dealing mainly with Cyprus immigrants. Mr. H. Daniller was in the chair.
