## Mr. G. Saron Attends J.D.C. Executive Committee Meeting in New York.

Mr. G. Saron, General Secretary of the Board of Deputies, was present at an Executive Committee meeting of the J.D.C. held in New York on 23rd October. Mr. Edward Warburg, Chairman of the J.D.C., welcomed Mr. Saron, and Mr. Jonah Wise, one of the vice-chairmen of the J.D.C., referred in glowing terms to the splendid work of the S.A. Jewish War Appeal.

Mr. Saron first of all referred to the high reputation that the J.D.C. had in South Africa. He then mentioned the fact that South Africa was a comparatively small community of 110,000 Jews, whose contribution to Jewish relief had been proportionately a very high one.

"I think that a very important contribution has been made by the J.D.C. in taking a broad inclusive view of Jewish needs to-day. One has to look at Jewish needs and the Jewish problem in a world sense, and J.D.C.'s work in Europe and in Palestine—seeing the thing as a totality—is a very important contribution towards this broader and more inclusive conception of the Jewish problem to-day.

"In that respect, too, I feel that your work in the cultural field, communal organisations, and so forth, makes something very progressive. It shows that you have gone beyond the rather a limited humanitarian approach and are seeing your work as a virtual reconstructive effort of Jewish life wherever such reconstruction has to be done."

Mr. Saron concluded by saying that South African Jewry was very happy, and feels itself privileged, to be associated with the J.D.C. in this tremendous task that faces world Jewry, and he could assure them that they would continue to get the whole-hearted co-operation of the J.W.A. in the future.

Mr. Saron also paid tribute to the help Dr. Joseph J. Schwartz and Lt.-Col. J. Nadih had given to the S.A. Jewish War Appeal.

## Concert for Jewish Refugee Children in London.

Mr. Michael Kusevitsky, the famous Polish-Jewish tenor, sang Yiddish, Polish and Hebrew songs at a concert arranged by Mr. M. S. Eisemann at the Scala Theatre for 850 Jewish children from refugee hostels and the West Norwood Jewish Orphanage. He was given a great ovation by the audience, which included also over 100 inmates of the Home for Jewish Incurables in Richmond. Other artistes, who gave their services voluntarily, included Messrs. Myer Rosenstein, pianist, Raymond Cohen, violinist, and Gerald Crossman, who delighted the audience when he asked them to join in as he played Jewish folk songs on the accordion. Refreshments had been provided free of charge by Jewish bakers and ice cream makers.

Jerusalem.

A young man who was arrested on Yom Kippur for blowing the Shofar at the Wailing Wall after the Neila service, was acquitted by a British judge. The judge accepted the plea of counsel for the defence that the prosecution had failed to prove that the young man is Jewish. Counsel pointed out that the blowing of the Shofar at the Wailing Wall is forbidden only for Jews.
