## Hedy Haas Recital.

Miss Hedy Haas, the Continental disease, presented an interesting programme at the Hofmeyr Hall on Tuesday and Wednesday nights under the title "Love, Life and Laughter of Five Nations." She gave a series of character impressions in English, French, Yiddish, Russian, Italian and, as an encore, German. She was best in the Yiddish and in "Der Wassertreger," "Klesmer Spielt" and "Der Gilgul fun a Niegun" and revealed deep understanding of the Jewish character and sympathy with Jewish customs. Other outstanding items were "Red, Amber, Green," a characterisation of a nervous lady, Katoucha (song of a French shepherdess) and Jenny.

Miss Haas is a gifted and versatile artist and has a bright and vivacious personality. She well deserved the fine ovation she received at the end of her performance.

Walter Swanson was the accompanist, and incidental music was provided by the Cantabile Trio and the solo violinist, Dagny Keightley.

"Lady in the Lake" at the Plaza is a murder story, a very unusual one from all accounts. But the way in which the story is told and presented seems to have created a good deal of interest. Dealing with the adventures of private detective Philip Marlowe, played by Robert Montgomery, Marlowe is seen only at rare intervals in the picture. Yet you are kept conscious of the fact that he is more or less there all the time. The audience sees what Marlowe sees. How a triple murder mystery is solved can only be revealed by seeing the entire picture so audiences are advised to be in at the beginning. Robert Montgomery was also producer of this Raymond Chandler story. Another very important player is Lloyd Nolan. But, judging from overseas accounts of "Lady in the Lake," the most powerful and not easily forgotten performance comes from Audrey Totter, while credit is said to be particularly due to Paul Vogel, who was responsible for the new camera technique employed in the taking of this thriller.
