## Anglo-Jewish Association Issues New Magazine.

London.

The Anglo-Jewish Association has started publication of a new magazine entitled "The Jewish Monthly". The magazine is devoted to cultural, economic and political problems concerning Anglo-Jewry and Jewish life throughout the world.

Well-known Jewish writers and communal workers, including Mr. L. G. Montefiore, Chairman of the I.C.A., the historian, Dr. Cecil Roth, Mr. Harold Soref, who represented the Anglo-Jewish Association at the Paris talks of Jewish organisations in connection with the Peace Conference, and Dr. Robert Weltsch, Palestine publicist and former editor of the Berlin "Juedische Rundschau," are among the contributors to the first issue, which also includes an article on "The Jews in South Africa" by Lewis Sowden.

## Aeroplane of Palestine Jewish Airline makes first Flight to London.

London.

An aeroplane of the Jewish Aviron Company arrived here from Palestine. It was the first flight of an aeroplane of the Company to Europe. The maiden trip of the plane was to Cyprus last Passover when representatives of the Jewish Agency and the Vaad Leumi went there to celebrate the festival together with the refugees.

The aeroplane is manned by a Jewish crew, and among five Jewish passengers were Mr. Shlomo Zalman Shragai, member of the Jewish Agency Executive, and the American Jewish journalist, Mr. Ben Israel.

## Adrina Otero.

Adrina Otero, the Spanish dancer, scored a great triumph when she gave her first performance in Cape Town on Wednesday evening, 7th May, at the Hofmeyr Hall, which was filled to capacity. She proved herself an artist of great skill and versatility, and each item on the programme evoked tremendous enthusiasm.

Adrina Otero displayed brilliant technique in the execution of Spanish dances, which conveyed the spirit which one usually associates with that country. The effect was heightened by the exquisite and colourful costumes and castanets. Mime and gesture were most expressive, interpreting the moods of the various dances to perfection, whether the romance and passion in the old Spain, the dance in pure classical style to the music of Albeniz, or the amusing behaviour of a shy, awkward little peasant girl.

Estelle de la Ville ably accompanied Adrina Otero on the piano, and also played solos by Spanish composers in between the dances.
