Benno Moiseiwitsch.

The great pianist Benno Moiseiwitsch will give his first Cape Town concert in the City Hall on Friday, 13th June. This will be his third tour of this country. He was here in 1930 and 1936.

Moiseiwitsch, who was born in Odessa on February 22, 1890, became a naturalised British subject in March, 1937.

He started his artistic career at the Imperial Music Academy, Odessa, where he won the Rubinstein Prize at the age of nine, later going to Vienna to study under Leschetizky. He made his debut in England on October 1, 1908, when he created a sensation. During the war of 1914-18, he was domiciled in England and only started touring abroad in 1919, since when he has played with almost every noted conductor in Europe and America.

Since 1919 Moiseiwitsch has toured America and Canada ten times, Australia and New Zealand five times, South America, India, the Dutch East Indies, Malaya, China and Japan. He knows Europe well and has toured Holland, France, Belgium, Austria, Hungary, Spain, Portugal, Poland and the Scandinavian countries. On leaving South Africa he intends to tour the United States and Australia again.

During the recent war, Moiseiwitsch remained in England and played all over the country. In spite of air raids and buzz bombs, concerts went on. Apart from his own engagements, he played for a great many charity concerts and for all sorts of charities, principally for Mrs. Churchill's Aid to Russia Fund. For that fund alone he gave 100 recitals. For his service to charity, he received the O.B.E.
