The Rabbi Kook Memorial literary prize of the Tel Aviv Municipality was awarded at a ceremony held on 26th June in Tel Aviv. The recipients are Rabbi Moshe Glick, Rabbi Yehuda Gershuni for works on Judaism, Rabbi Haim Heller, of America, for a work on Rambam. A special prize was awarded to the editors of the Talmudical Encyclopaedia (the first volume of which has now appeared), Rabbis Meir Berlin and Shlomo Zvin.

The Central Conference of American Rabbis which is the central organisation for reform of the Rabbinate passed a resolution urging the Fact-Finding Committee to visit the D.P. camps since the Palestine problem cannot be separated from the problems of Europe's homeless Jews. The Conference condemned both terrorism and British repression which leads to terrorism and urged free immigration and colonisation.

COLOSSEUM.

"The Man Within," a new Sydney Box Technicolour production commencing on Monday, is said to be a worthy addition to the ever-lengthening list of successes credited to the prolific producer of the famous "Seventh Veil."

Adapted from the novel by Graham Greene, the film is the story of the smugglers who ravaged the British coasts during the early part of the 19th century.

The stars of the film are Michael Redgrave, one of Britain's most accomplished actors, Jean Kent, Joan Greenwood, Richard Attenborough, Francis L. Sullivan, Felix Aylmer, Ernest Thesiger and Ronald Shiner.

The title of both the book and the film is taken from the famous quotation by Sir Thomas Browne: "There is another man within me that is angry with me."

To make the film as realistic as possible no efforts were spared by producers Muriel and Sydney Box and director Bernard Knowles. Many exterior shots were taken on Britain's stormy coasts, and on one occasion part of the film unit was actually shipwrecked.
