Molly Picon.

Molly Picon, a leading New York comedienne, who is at present attracting huge audiences to His Majesty's Theatre in Johannesburg, will appear in Cape Town at the Alhambra Theatre from Friday, 25th July.

Miss Picon first visited South Africa in 1937, when she was described as a "singing Ruth Draper allied to a Sophie Tucker." She is chiefly famous for her studies of types in a large town. She has them all at her fingertips, from the tired working girl to the mischievous, comical newsboy. Her work has been most aptly described as being a one-woman symphony of life in a great city. Molly Picon has been in the show business practically all her life, and has appeared in concerts, plays, musicals and radio shows in more places in the world than she can remember. She loves going about.

During the past ten years Molly and her husband (who has accompanied her to South Africa) haven't sat still for a minute. Musical shows on Broadway, vaudeville straight plays, appearances in practically every city and quick trips over to the Continent for more shows. On top of that they do a 15-minute radio programme every day, six months every year.

During the war Molly gave shows in camps and hospitals, base camps, transit camps, she sang for the Navy, the Army and the Air Force—sometimes three shows a day.

Miss Picon's appearance at the Alhambra Theatre will take up the second half of the programme, the first half being devoted to the Technicolour film "Concerto" (or "I've Always Loved You"), the piano music in which is played by the famous musician Arthur Rubinstein.
