"EXODUS" PASSENGERS REFUSE TO LAND IN FRANCE.

S. E. Kay, British Consul-General in Marseilles left the harbour with French officials in police boats.

"The whole of the foredeck of the 'Ocean Vigour' was a tangle of wire cages," said a correspondent. "All constitution of the skip immigrants. along the side of the ship immigrants were massed in what looked like a solid block of human flesh clinging to the wire and staring silently at our

"A short distance from the ship a small fishing vessel chartered by Ha-ganah and equipped with a loudspeaker was urging the refugees to stay aboard at any cost."

TERRIBLE CONDITIONS.

The refugees told a French prefect that the conditions were terrible. They were treated like cattle which was a punishment for their wanting to return to the only land willing to receive them. They thanked the French for the kindness and hospitality offered the kindness and hospitality offered them which touched them but they were convinced the French people understood their feelings. There was only one course—Palestine—for safeguarding their future. When the prefect who boarded the ships, asked about the sick a spokesman replied: "They will get well in Palestine." The prefect shook hands with the spokesman and all cried "Vive le France" and stood up as they sang France' and stood up as they sang "Hatikvah." The Frenchmen snapped to attention and a few of them had tears in their eyes.

The spokesman issued the following statement in Yiddish: "All the refugees on the ship are ex-partisans and ex-fighters in the Allied armies and survivors of concentration camps and survivors of concentration camps and their main wish is to return to Palestine." The Frenchmen were deeply moved by the Jews' stand and discipline despite their misery. One Frenchman said, "I never imagined refugees could take such a heroic stand or that conditions could be so bad." He said he had been in a concentration camp but he would never exchange that for but he would never exchange that for the ship.

It is reported from Washington that Senator Edwin Johnson asked for American aid for the "Exodus" refugees in a statement placed on Congressional record in the last few hours of the Congressional session. He said President Truman has the power to direct the U.S.A. military and naval authorities in Europe to offer aid.

It is reported that the refugees have been transported back to F waters in the three British ships.
