Mabella Ott-Penetto Recital.

The Recital at the City Hall last Saturday night by the dramatic contralto, Mabella Ott-Penetto, in conjunction with the Municipal Orchestra was an outstanding success from every point of view and great credit is due to the Bnoth Zion Association, who were responsible for the arrangements, the proceeds going to the J.N.F.

There was a large and appreciative audience present and Mabella Ott-Penetto received an ovation after each item. In the first half of the programme she sang "Laxia Ch'io Pianga" (Handel), a group of Brahms lieder, and "In Memoriam" by O. Ulmer, composed by a Swiss musician and dedicated to those who died victims of Hitler. In each of these she showed herself a great artist and the possessor of a magnificent voice.

After the interval Mabella Ott-Penetto sang "Fair Spring is Returning" and "Softly Awakes My Heart" from "Samson and Delilah." These were sung with consummate skill and artistry and evoked such enthusiasm that the latter had to be repeated. The climax of the evening came with her singing of "Eili Eili," which was rendered with such deep feeling that many of the audience were moved to tears. In response to the tumultuous applause, this, too, was repeated.

The Orchestra, conducted by Geoffrey Miller, accompanied the singer sympathetically and also played the overtures "Figaro" and "Fingal's Cave" and Tchaikovsky's "Andante Cantabile for Strings."
