Yiddish Concert at Paarl.

"Tumel in Stotgorten," the Yiddish play written by G. Laden and B. Mirvish and produced by Alfred Faclier, was shown by popular request at Paarl on Sunday night, 25th November. The Paarl Talmud Torah Hall was filled by an appreciative audience, who were thoroughly entertained by the play.

The artists excelled themselves, and the scenes "Modern Education," with Mrs. Turok and Mrs. Lidsky as the balebostes, and the "Political Debate," with D. Feinstein, M. Kretzmer, O. Rabinowitz, I. Glick and H. Konvasser, were warmly received. Mr. Alfred Faclier and Mr. B. Rod as the salesmen, and Mr. G. Figovsky, M. Kretzmer, T. Horner and D. Feinstein in "A Chazan af Probe," gave fine portrayals.

Hedy Haas, the well-known diseuse, gave several items, which were greatly applauded, and Miss Shulman, a very good soprano, sang. Mr. A. Rubinstein gave a profoundly moving interpretation of the poems "Afn oilem haemes" and "Lokshenbret."

Mention should be made of the Zionist Socialist Youth Choir under the baton of Mr. W. Sher and accompanied by Walter Morgan, who were present in full strength and gave a very fine performance. Sheila Goldin, as the soloist in "The Havdole," sang with feeling and sweetness and was loudly applauded by the audience.

S.A. Torah Va'Avodah Camp.

The Third South African Torah Va-Avodah (Hapoel Hamizrachi and Hashomer Hadati) Camp to be held at Lakeside will commence on the 16th December, and will last for three weeks. It is expected that 120 Chaverim and Chaverot from Johannesburg, Cape Town and other parts of the Union, will participate.

The Camp, which will be under the leadership of Sammy Caplan, represents the culminating event of the activities in the movement during the last year. Much of the time will be devoted to Sichot, organisational discussions, scouting, and the study of Holy Writings. Camp provides an opportunity for the Chaverim of different Snifim to get together and to discuss problems of hadrachach and irgun.

Visitors to Muizenberg are invited to attend the Shabbat Services which are held at Camp. They will find them unique in that they embrace Ashkenazi, Sephardi, Mitnaged and Chassidic tunes, prayers and customs. There is scarcely a Service conducted anywhere in South Africa which can rival our Camp Services in their beauty and impressiveness.

At Camp, Chaverim will probably have an opportunity of meeting our Shaliach from Bachad of England.

800 Habonim Campers this Year.

OVER 500 AT NAHOON.

The record number of over 500 campers of Habonim will attend the annual Transvaal Camp at Nahoon, East London. This is probably the largest Zionist Youth Camp ever held in this country, and is testimony to the growing strength of Habonim. In addition to this Camp, Habonim will be holding two others, one for Western Province Habonim and one for Natal Habonim, and the total attending the three Camps will be approximately 800. This large Camp is the climax of a highly successful year of activities for Habonim.

The Nahoon Camp is again being run in an honorary capacity by Segan Ba-Koach Harry Schewitz, and the Manhig of Habonim, Louis Krokin. For the first time the Camp will be run in three different sections according to age groups.

A very important innovation is the running of the Shomrim Shichvah (for those over 16 years of age). The Camp theme for this Shichvah is the original idea of founding a kibbutz—on arrival they will go on hityashvut, and set up their Camp. For the remaining period they will function as far as possible like a kibbutz, aided and guided by a few members of the Habonim Hachsharah Farm who are attending the Camp.

The other schavot, i.e. Bonim (12-16) and Shtilim (10-12), have worked out full programmes in which their main education will be "put across" by means of "projects" in conformity with the teachings of the most progressive educational institutions in all parts of the world.

Apart from the projects, a major portion of the time will be spent swimming, playing games such as volleyball and soft ball, and in exploring the surrounding countryside. All this is bound to work up amazing appetites and plans are well advanced to ensure that the campers' needs will be well catered for. Kashrut will be observed throughout.

Another vital section of Camp is the "Hospital Section," which is staffed by a doctor, two fully trained sisters and a number of medical students. In addition to attending to any campers who may be a bit "off colour," the hospital staff will see to it that the kitchen wash-places and latrines, etc., are kept clean, thus ensuring that everybody will live in a healthy environment.

Probably the most enjoyable part of the Camp day comes after supper, when the whole camp participates in different forms of evening entertainment. "Old" campers will testify that nothing is so pleasant as relaxing and singing around a camp fire, with the mountains rising on the one side, the beach dropping away on the other and myriads of stars twinkling down on the scene from far above.

Over 90 experienced officers of the movement are intent on making this year's Camp a happy and healthy place so that it will be a true culmination of the year's activities and a continuation of Habonim's aim of teaching Jewish youth "how to think and not what to think."
