DR. I. SLOME.

Dr. Irving (Isadore) Slome, son of Mr. and Mrs. S. Slome, of Muizenberg, died suddenly on Monday of last week in London, where he had been living for 17 years.

Dr. Slome, who was 36, was born in Cape Town and educated at the South African College School and at the University of Cape Town, where he had a brilliant career. After taking his M.A. degree, he went to London to take medical degrees. He remained there, and has been lecturing and teaching medical subjects.

Second Annual Bnei Zion Camp.

Once again the Bnei Zion Movement will be camping in the Cape Peninsula, this time at Fish Hoek, where they were able to secure an ideal camping site, which augurs well for the second annual camp. Last year the movement's first camp was held at Lakeside, where approximately 150 campers attended. It is estimated that with the growth and development of the movement there will be well over 250 members of the movement under canvas. In addition, there will be at least 50 fully qualified Madrichim (officers), who will be responsible for the health and well-being of the campers.

Elaborate plans have been drafted for the programme, which will give an intensive education in cultural and scouting activities in a novel manner. Preliminary arrangements have been made in regard to supplies and equipment, and a first-class camp seems assured. All matters relating to health will be under expert supervision. Kashruth will be strictly observed.

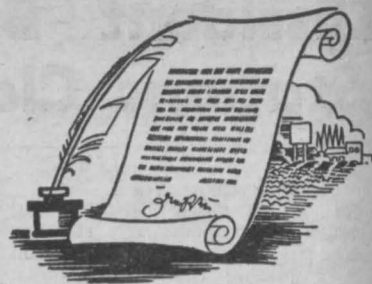
