## Help for the Needy

THROUGH the initiative of Mrs. THROUGH the initiative of Mrs. Sarah Herzog, the wife of the Chief Rabbi of Palestine, during her visit to this country just over three years ago, a committee was formed under the supervision of the S.A. Jewish Board of Deputies, to help needy institutions in Eretz Israel.

Although the committee, with Mrs. I. Adelson, as chairman, limited its assistance at first to only eight institutions, owing to repeated urgent appeals received, the number of institutions now getting regular monthly support has increased to fourteen.

Amongst these are principally, the Chonen Dal Bread Society, which distributes bread to the poor and destitute, eight children's homes, two maternity societies, one free kitchen, a mental home and one hospital.

The Society's first remittance was £30. This amount has now reached a monthly average of £150. All books are audited by the Board of Deputies, and no expenses, except printing, are incurred.

A general meeting for members and donors will be called in the near future, and the Committee hopes that all persons interested will attend.
