This child, too, is father to the man; Kasrielevky's humour is in Mottel's bones; Kasrielevky is a grown-up Mottel, not as adept as he in the creative transvaluation of values, but still native to the practice. "Let's look at the thing upside down, maybe that's the right way up."

This will help to explain why Kasrielevkites who could grin wryly at a pogrom insisted on shedding tears at a wedding. Ostensibly Jews are forbidden to know perfect joy as long as the Jewish homeland is in ruins and the Glory in exile; the breaking of dishes at betrothals and weddings is a memorial of the Destruction.

But the Kasrielevkites were not content with this formal acknowledgment. They had a custom which is one of the world's curiosities, the "keening" at the wedding. The badchan, or professional jester, without whom a marriage ceremony would have been as incomplete as without musicians, had to make the guests cry as well as laugh. The bride was seated in state, and the badchan walked to and fro wailing over her as if she were about to be buried. He mourned her lost childhood, and dwelt on the burdens and sorrows of the life on which she was entering. "Weep, little bride, weep, think of the years to come, the pain of motherhood, the separation from your beloved parents, the sadness of old age. . . ." And he kept it up until bride and bridegroom, relatives and guests, were dissolved in tears. This, too, was part of Kasrielevky's humour.
