Meet Sgt. Lazarus: His Mementos are Treasured by The World's Greatest Celebrities

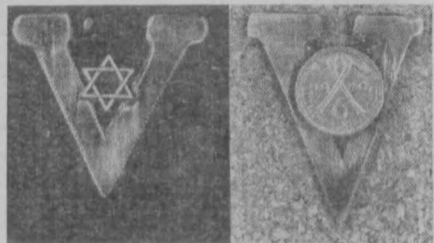


send you my grateful thanks and can assure you that I shall love to wear it."

This friendly letter from Mrs. Smuts encouraged Sgt. Lazarus greatly. He set to work and made V brooches for great people all over the world. He made it his business to find odd coins of bygone periods, and received the thanks of almost 100 great men and women from every corner of the globe. Sgt. Lazarus showed me duplicates of some of the brooches he had made. They are quite original.

General Eisenhower received his brooch in battle-scarred France. He was very much impressed. "It is most unusual, and I shall always value it very much. I truly appreciate the thought that prompted you to do this."

And when Weizmann was receiving hundreds of cables and gifts from all over congratulating him on his seventieth birthday, he, too, received a small package from Sgt. Lazarus. (Photo below shows brooch sent to Dr. Weizmann. The Hebrew word "Zion" is inscribed



on the Magen David.) "I shall treasure it very much," wrote Dr. Weizmann in reply.

The photograph on the right is of the brooches sent to Mr. Churchill and General Eisenhower. The coin shows two crossed axes—"as a symbol of the tools you will get to crush the Nazi regime," wrote Sgt. Lazarus.

Sgt. Albert Lazarus, who was recently discharged from the army on account of ill-health, is a lively old man with a jovial disposition. His hobby takes much of his time, for he is continually searching for odd coins, making brooches and sending them off. It is certainly an unusual occupation. But it's good work and the Sergeant likes it.

S.A.A.F. Association Formed

"COMRADES in War and Peace" is the title of a pamphlet issued by the South African Air Force Association. The pamphlet is attractively set up, and gives an outline of the aims and objects of the newly-formed association.

One of the major purposes of the Air Force Association is to fight "Fear and Want," and to co-operate with other organisations with similar aims. A provisional committee, headed by Col. Rod Douglas, has been formed, and among its plans are: the formation of branches throughout the Union; the creation of machinery to find improved avenues of employment for ex-Air Force personnel on an intimate and personal basis; the raising of funds to provide urgent financial assistance and to establish bursaries and educational grants, etc.

Membership is open to all ranks, past and present, men and women who have served for a period of not less than three months in any of the following services or corps: S.A.A.F., S.A. Women's Auxiliary Air Force, other arms or corps of the U.D.F. or W.A.D.C., Royal Air Forces, Dominion Air Forces, Colonial Air Forces and Allied Air Forces.

The fee for annual membership is 10s. and for life membership £5 5s. All further information may be obtained from the Hon. Secretary, S.A.A.F. Association, P.O. Box 5997, Johannesburg.
