Ethyn Seftel is a competent new singer, and Mr. Idelson deserves to be congratulated on introducing her to the audience. Betty Pack was well received as usual when she played a composition by Mr. Idelson. Braam Verhoef led the orchestra, and other names worthy of mention are Joshua Herison and Max Weltman.

During the evening Mr. J. Daleski, Chairman of the Choral Society, addressed the gathering. He urged the importance of developing Jewish musical activity and asked the public to support the valuable work done by the Society. He made a special appeal for more members for the choir.
