A VIRTUOSO OF THE VIOLIN

Fine Recitals by Thomas Matthews

It is rare that violin-lovers are treated with such exquisite fare as was offered by Thomas Matthews at his concerts on Wednesday and Sunday nights. Mr. Matthews has the art of arousing the deepest feelings in his audience without resorting to any calculated and obvious technique.

He chose a varied programme for his Sunday night concert. In Chaconne, he not only displayed his virtuosity as a musician, but interpreted Bach with supreme delicacy and beauty.

Delius' Sonata No. 2 was played with restraint and lyricism, and with a pureness and subtlety of tone, which will not soon be forgotten.

Mr. Ashley Hartley was an able accompanist in Greig's popular Sonata in C. Other items in the programme included Correll's La Folia, Song Without Words and the Rondo by Mozart.

After Mr. Matthews had overcome a little initial unevenness of bowing, the performance was delightful throughout.

At his opening concert on Wednesday night, Mr. Matthews played to a packed hall and established himself as a warm favourite with South African music lovers.

His playing of the Elgar Violin Concerto was superb, as was his Vivaldi's Concerto which was played with warmth and understanding. The S.A.B.C. orchestra, under the baton of Mr. Jerry Schulman, gave good support.

Mr Matthews is without doubt one of the most accomplished violinists we have heard in Johannesburg for a long time.
