The Cinema

A MUSICAL comedy which is definitely of a higher standard than the regular film in this branch of cinema fare is "SHOW BUSINESS" which surpasses in humour, music and general entertainment value anything we have seen this year. Eddie Cantor has lost none of his prowess as a master comedian, and from the moment he enters upon the scene there is hardly a break in the laughter. Joan Davis as the girl in love with Eddy is responsible, too, for much of the humour. The romantic interest is provided by George Murphy and Nancy Kelly, and the story, unlike that in many other musicals, is not merely incidental to the musical background, but forms an important part of the film. Don't miss it at the COLOSSEUM! . . . The strange story of a young woman with abnormal emotions and her almost destructive influence on the family with whom she is spending a holiday is the theme of "GUEST IN THE HOUSE," which is playing to packed houses at the 20th CENTURY. The film is a searching study of a psychopathic personality. Its story focuses on the strangely twisted impulses of a seemingly innocent girl, and reveals the functioning of a "split personality." In the major roles are Anne Baxter, who is seen in an entirely new part, and Ralph Bellamy, who plays with conviction the sensitive artist whose life is nearly warped through the machinations of the wilful visitor. First-rate swing music is provided in "SEVEN DAYS ASHORE," the tune-filled musical comedy which is now showing at the PLAZA. The story is that of a sailor who meets his fiancée at one of the ports. The trouble starts when the sailor meets two of his fiancée's girl-friends as well and treats them in a "friendly" way. Good comedy and excellent entertainment . . . A portrayal of life at its fastest, comedy at its best, dialogue at its wittiest—that is "WEEK-END AT THE WALDORF," the film which is having a long run at the Metro. Although the story is based on a mere 48-hour period, more happens in the lives of the main players (Ginger Rogers, Walter Pidgeon, Lana Turner and Van Johnson) than what normally happens to four people in a life time. It is a story with no moral and a happy ending . . . A review of "MR. EMMANUEL," the film which is being very well received at the EMPIRE, will appear in our next week's issue.
