Hebrew Army Songs at City Concert

Despite the inclement weather, there was a large audience at the concert given in aid of the Palestinian Soldiers' Comforts Fund. Jerry Idelson had obviously devoted much time and energy to the orchestra, which he conducted with great skill. The orchestra was led by Bram Verhoef, who was as popular as ever with the audience.

Eugene Magrid, the soloist in Mendelssohn's Concerto, displayed precision and refinement in the execution of the composition. Jayne Susman was heartily applauded when she rendered an aria from Traviata.

Great interest was aroused by the audience in the monologue by Zeitlin, recited by F. Zyguelbaum.

The concert concluded with a most interesting novelty—the rendering of a group of Palestinian soldier songs by Pinkie Stromin. This performance was particularly welcomed by the audience, firstly because the songs displayed the heroism of the Jewish soldier and also because they gave something new in Hebrew songs. There is far too much of a tendency among our singers to render always the same songs.

At the conclusion of the concert Mr. A. Etkin, chairman of the fund, thanked the artists and the audience for their support.

Springbok Favourite To Play In Johannesburg

SARAH BODANKIN—Outstanding Palestinian Pianiste



exceptional talent and, encouraged by her teachers, she went to Vienna after graduating from High School. She studied at the Viennese Academy for Music under Emil Sauer, and appeared on many concert platforms in that city. Her studies were interrupted with the annexation of Austria and she returned to Palestine.

She soon attained great popularity among the music loving people of the Yishuv, attracting large audiences wherever she played. Miss Bodankin is at present attached to the staff of the Music Institute in Haifa, run by Mrs. D. Weizmann, a sister of Dr. Chaim Weizmann.

Her husband, who was formerly practising law in Johannesburg, went to Palestine in 1936 on a University tour, but he liked the country so much that he decided to settle there. Many Springboks who visited Palestine during the war enjoyed their hospitality, and Miss Bodankin also provided for them many delightful musical treats.

Miss Bodankin will shortly return to Palestine where her husband has already preceded her.

REGARDED as one of Palestine's most gifted pianists, Sarah Bodankin (Mrs. Leonard Rabinowitz), who is visiting relations in Johannesburg, will give a recital at the Empire Theatre on November 18, at the invitation of African Consolidated Theatres, Ltd.

Miss Bodankin was only seven when she started her music after arriving in Palestine from Russia. She showed
