Themeli Warmly Welcomed

GEORGES THEMELI was given a rousing welcome when he appeared for the first time at the Metro Theatre on Sunday at a concert arranged by the Friends of the Soviet Union.

He played Beethoven's Emperor Concerto with remarkable skill, displaying complete mastery of the work. Despite his physical handicap and the fact that he had hardly had an opportunity of rehearsing with the orchestra, he managed to merge into the general performance with amazing ease.

Themeli possesses a gentleness of touch and a soft approach to his instrument which should be the envy of some of the women pianists whom we have heard in this country recently. He is a great pianist and it is hoped that he will give many more recitals in this town. The orchestra conducted by Mr. Dunn, was in particularly good form, especially the violins, led by Mr. Bram Verhoef.

Tschaikovsky's symphony Pathétique was very well played, though there was a slight lack in the depth of interpretation. Full use was made of the dramatic feature of this Russian composition.
