Great Musical Occasion

IT is an irony of fate that Georges Themeli, the man whose world will always be dark, should give so much light to others. For one cannot help associating brilliant playing with radiance and sunshine.

On Wednesday night he opened his concert with the well-known Mozart Sonata in A major, performing the variations with a lightness and delicacy of touch in contrast to the strength and energy of the "Alla Turca.

The highlight of the evening was ne Waldstein Sonata, a Titanic work, which Themeli played with or-chestral effect. The opening move-ment commenced with a brilliance which put the performer in the front rank of pianists. The adagio move-ment was played with a cello-like clarity and sweetness. The last movement was magnificent.

The artist did full justice to one of Beethoven's greatest Sonata movements, which he played with a passion and understanding that created a deep impression upon the audience.

a deep impression upon the audience. The graceful and delicate Valse Oublie of Liszt opened the second half of the programme, followed by Liszt's Funerailles, a brilliant performance displaying to the full the artist's amazing technique and strength strength.

Themeli also played three Chopin Perhaps one of the whole evening was

Chopin's Berceuse played as an encore. In it the artist displayed a silken smootheness and a crystal clarity that enraptured the listeners.

One felt that the great homage Johannesburg music lovers paid to Themeli was due as much to the artist as to the great man who conquered a cruel affliction of nature and achieved a triumph rarely vouschafed to any mortal.
