Annual General Meeting

The annual general meeting of the Students' Zionist Association was held at Milner Park on March 20. Mr. H. Stutzen presided.

The retiring chairman, Mr. R. Shatz, in his report for the year 1945 said that the S.Z.A. had found it necessary to reorganise its programme by holding lunch-hour meetings, addressed by prominent Zionist speakers, in place of the study circles organised on party lines. Classes in Hebrew and Jewish ethics had also been arranged.

An effort will be made to extend Zionist activities at the University so that every student should become aware of Zionism. With so many Jewish ex-Servicemen back at the University, it should be possible to achieve outstanding results.

Emphasis was made by many speakers of the necessity of the Students' Zionist Association devoting itself to purely Zionist affairs, as it was thought that there were already enough societies to cater for non-Zionist activities.
